Recommendation	Organization Name	Purpose	Allocation
1	Access Youth Academy	To fund the Active Career Pathways program, which connects industry executives from the sports, active and healthy lifestyle industries with underserved youth to share possible career pathways. This will help strengthen our workforce and local economy.	\$5,000
2	Fern Street Community Arts, Inc.	To fund the 30 th Anniversary Fern Street Circus Neighborhood Tour, with socially distanced Pop-Up Performances at drive-through food sites, primarily at schools, enhancing the local arts and cultural scene.	\$15,000
3	Homeless Veterans of San Diego	To fund outreach program support, including social media/marketing, transportation expenses, supplies, and technology, to support programs that help improve the lives of residents who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.	\$20,000
4	I Love a Clean San Diego	To fund the Coastal Cleanup Day and Creek to Bay Cleanup, which helps clean and maintain the local coastline and creek areas.	\$35,000
5	Miracle Babies	To fund a "Special Delivery" van transporting new parents to unite with their babies in the NICU (neonatal intensive care unit), thereby supporting parents and	\$25,000

6	San Diego Architectural Foundation	To fund a one-time application to create a virtual option for Open House 2021, ensuring that visitors can “visit” featured architecture throughout the County, thereby promoting our local landscape.	\$5,000
7	San Diego Council on Literacy	To fund operational costs for online instructional programming, as well as equipment, rentals, and labor for the coordination, collection and promotion of book deliveries. These efforts will ultimately create jobs and promote literacy, thereby strengthening our workforce and economy.	\$10,000
8	San Diego Junior Theatre	To fund marketing and a website redesign and update, supporting their efforts to enhance the local arts and culture scene for youth and their families.	\$7,000
9	Social and Environmental Entrepreneurs (SEE), Inc. dba The Veterans Art Project	To fund therapeutic art courses and art exhibits by veterans, enhancing the local arts and culture scene and improving the quality of life for local veterans.	\$11,600
10	The San Diego Bicycle Club, Inc.	To fund the 2021 Barrio Logan Grand Prix, promoting San Diego as a destination with one of Southern California’s largest cycling events.	\$20,000
11	Voices for Children	To fund informational videos and public service announcements, collateral materials and direct mail, educating citizens about foster youth and supporting their efforts to help improve overall quality of life for abused and neglected children.	\$25,000
